The Secret Compartment by Brad Beady

This is the second article in the Secret Compartment series looking at magic on multiple media platforms. In this issue, I focus on magic showcased on video streaming platforms such as Netflix, Hulu and Disney+.

<u>In & Of Itself</u> (Hulu): Let me start by saying that I firmly believe that this should be **mandatory** watching for anyone interested in magic. For those of you who do not know what this is, magician Derek Delgaudio explores the illusion of identity in a filmed version of a show which he performed over 500 times in NYC. I saw *In & Of Itself* live on 3 separate occasions and even after watching this movie version of the show it still brings me the same amount of wonder and amazement. This show is a prime example of how we as magicians can use our abilities to tell stories and spark discussions rather than doing magic for magic's sake.

Magic for Humans (Netflix): Now in its third season, magician Justin Willman (AKA Justin Kredible from way back when) tackles topics such as self-control, time and tradition in this fun episodic magic show. I think Willman does a great job of presenting magic on television. What I like about the show is, unlike a similar TV magic show, The Carbonaro Effect, Willman is upfront with his participants, telling them he is a magician performing magic tricks. Otherwise, it feels more like playing pranks on people rather than showing them magic. Also, unlike popular TikTokreaction-based magic videos, these are genuine, not overhyped reactions to magic tricks most magicians are familiar with. Worth a watch.

<u>WandaVision</u> (Disney+): Although not a magic based show, the second episode of the Avengers spin-off show has the two main characters/superheroes, Wanda and Vision, performing a traditional magic show for a fundraiser. When the drunken Vision resorts to using his powers to create impossibilities, Wanda reverts to using her powers to reveal typical magic methods being used. I find it amusing that this is the exact opposite of how most magic effects are performed; a superpower is showcased while the method is hidden.
